Our elementary program is designed to complement your home education journey with hands-on science, music, art, and other activities, all with a Biblical foundation and focus. This year, we will be touching all of the subjects through various themes, a mix of specific academic areas and activities to make it fun! We understand that many families are new to homeschooling, so it is our goal to walk alongside them, while allowing the children to experience the fun of learning in a small group of other home educated children. Children will be grouped according to age and ability within the program as needed. Middle School and High School Academy Classes

Astronomy (Grades 6-8) 8:30-9:55am

In this course, your student will explore and learn about the sun, planets, asteroid belt, dwarf planets, the Kuiper belt galaxies, nebulae, and even black holes as they reveal the marvel and might of our loving Creator. We will begin by learning about the sun, the planets in our solar system, the stars, galaxies, and space travel. Their awareness of the beauty of the universe and its Creator will expand as they expand their studies to the far reaches of what we can see out in space. Students will build a model solar system, make a solar eclipse, compass, and telescope, watch a meteor shower, launch a rocket, make clouds, and locate constellations. We hope to join with local astronomy groups on field trips and will be bringing the StarDome, a portable planetarium in for a special experience.

HS Civics/Government (Grades 9-12) 8:30-9:55am

Dive into the heart of American democracy with our focused Civics class, designed to illuminate the workings of the U.S. government and the Constitution. This interactive course invites students to engage deeply with the principles that shaped our nation, from the thoughts of the framers and founders to the pivotal role of the Supreme Court and the fundamental freedoms enshrined in the Bill of Rights. Through a blend of lectures and group discussions, students will sharpen their critical thinking skills and debate and dissect the core aspects of government and civic participation. Homework is crafted to reinforce learning, with practical worksheets, selected readings, and concise writing tasks—no lengthy essays, just clear, thoughtful paragraphs. Adding a layer of understanding, we'll also touch on U.S. geography.

Assessments include class participation, written assignments, and quizzes.

This class isn't just academic; it's a journey into active citizenship, offering tools for engagement in the great American experiment. Join us to empower your high schooler with knowledge and confidence in their civic role.

HS The Language of Literature (Grades 9-12) 11:05am-12:30pm

Welcome to this high school literature class designed to spark curiosity and appreciation for the rich tapestry of literary expression. The carefully curated curriculum covers a diverse array of genres including fiction, non-fiction, poetry, drama, and a special high-level look at Shakespeare's, *Julius Caesar*. Students will explore the fundamentals of literature, from theme and plot elements to characterization and literary devices such as metaphor, simile, personification, imagery and more.

Each week, students will receive either printouts or links to thoughtfully selected stories that exemplify the week's learning focus chosen with great care to ensure appropriateness and relevance. Prior to the commencement of classes, parents will be provided with a comprehensive list of these materials for review, offering an opportunity for families to be involved in the educational journey. I welcome and respect parental input, allowing for the option to opt-out of certain readings without any impact on student grading. Please know that stories will be chosen with the utmost of care ensuring a respectful alignment with each family's values.

The class is structured to promote active participation and critical thinking, with activities including group discussions, engaging worksheets, creative writing exercises, vocabulary building, and quizzes. Writing assignments are designed to be approachable focusing on paragraph-style short essay responses that sharpen students' analytical and expressive skills without the pressure of long essays. In fact, no essays will be assigned.

This literature class is not just an academic endeavor; it's an invitation to explore the vast landscapes of human experience and emotion through the written word. It's an opportunity for students to open the door to a world where literature becomes a gateway to understanding the complexity and beauty of the human condition.
