When, Where and How.

- The Bridge meets on **Thursdays**, for 33-34 weeks. We have two semesters Spring and Fall. Enrollment and payment are by school year unless the class is specifically a one-semester class.
- We meet at Bible Baptist Church located at 2113 57th St E (Morgan Johnson Rd.), Bradenton, FL 34208
- We enroll students in grades **K through twelfth grade**.
- All Registration for new families is In-Person only. Exceptions are made with administrator approval on a case-by-case basis.

Who's Involved?

• Once enrolled for classes, please make plans to attend the **Family Orientation** designed just for you to learn your way around The Bridge and meet our Teachers, Staff, and family volunteers. See the Important Calendar Events on page 1 for dates and times.

What's the Cost?

- **Class costs** are based on a 55 or 120 minute class period for a 10 to 16-week semester or a full year of 33-34 weeks. See schedule for class cost and fees. Many classes have additional charges for materials and supplies.
- A \$25 deposit for each student for the school year. This is a Non-Refundable Registration Fee.
- A \$10 technology fee for each family for the school year. This is a Non-Refundable Fee to cover the costs of our website, class work scheduling and communication with teachers and families.

Stay Informed!

- The best way to keep up on all that is going on at The Bridge is to check your email each week. WE COMMUNICATE PRIMARILY THROUGH EMAIL and OUR HOMESCHOOL-LIFE PLATFROM. Once registered, all families, both students and parents, are expected to log in to the website portal and keep up with forum and teachers' communications.

Apologia Zoology, General Science lab work, Literature and enrichment writing. Please note, most of the class will be co-taught as a group. However, for writing, classes will be divided K-2 and 3 - 5 as writing skill will differ significantly.

- The Elementary Program is not a drop-off. Parents must stay on campus and either help in the class or volunteer elsewhere. Parents requiring nursery care may organize their own co-op time. There is a playground, fellowship hall and kitchen available for our use.
- Middle School parents are required to be on campus until students have demonstrated that they can successfully navigate the day with independent self-government and decorum.
- All families with students in 6th-12th grades are required to volunteer regularly. Duties might include morning set up, afternoon tear down, vacuuming and wiping tables or organizing a field trip.

Fees:

- Registration fee is \$25 per student, capped at \$75 per family. Technology fee is \$10 per family.
- Elementary morning classes are \$300 and upper classes are \$275 as a one-time fee per year plus a material fee. Class and materials fees are due at registration.
- We are a direct provider and ALL fees can be paid through the SUFS website. If you are not a scholarship student and need to make payments, please reach out.

Class Descriptions

Elementary Program: 9:30am-11:30am (lunch 11:30am-12:25pm)

Teachers – Brenda Jones and Melanie Wallenstein

The elementary program will have a three-tiered approach. First, students will examine Apologia's Zoology course which will study the animal kingdom through a biblical lens emphasizing God's design and creation. It's designed for elementary students and incorporates hands-on activities, engaging lessons, and vivid graphics to make learning about animals and their ecosystems come alive. The curriculum covers a range of topics, from basic anatomy and physiology to animal behavior and ecosystems. In addition, general science topics will be explored in weekly hands-on activities to

keep students engaged in active learning.

For the last part of the class, students will be exposed to age-appropriate literature and then write using prompts taken from the story. No writing experience is necessary. This is simply meant to remove writing roadblocks and get students used to writing from an early age. Very young writers may simply work on letter and word formation while older students can work more on composition.

Cost: \$300

<u>Supplies provided by student:</u> Apologia zoology book notebooking journal, pencils, pencil sharpener, crayons, liquid and stick glue, and colored pencils. Please note, the textbook is optional for the parent; both textbook and journal book are found in the SUFS marketplace.

Class supplies fee: \$50

Middle School and High School Academy Classes

American Sign Language (Grades 6th-12th) 9:00 – 9:50

Taught by Dr. Sherri Schieferstein

Discover the fundamentals of American Sign Language (ASL) in this introductory course. You'll explore the core components of ASL, including its parameters, syntax, sentence structure, and the crucial role of facial expressions and body language. We'll also delve into nouns, verbs, modals, sign space, time concepts, classifiers, and pluralization. Beyond the linguistic aspects, you'll gain insight into fingerspelling (numbers and lexicalized forms), conceptual accuracy, sign modulation, conversational regulators, and the rich history and culture of the American Deaf community, understanding how ASL embodies their values, beliefs, and customs.

Cost: \$275 Prerequisite: None

<u>Materials/requirements:</u> Note taking materials and a \$10 materials fee to be paid at time of registration. The instructor will provide any other needed materials

Middle/High School Literature and writing (Grades 6th-12th) 10:00 -10:50

Taught Amy Sullivan

The carefully curated curriculum covers a diverse array of the four main genres including fiction, non- fiction, poetry, and drama. Students will explore the fundamentals of literature, from theme and plot elements to characterization and literary devices such as metaphor, simile, personification, imagery and more.

Each week, students will explore thoughtfully selected stories that exemplify weekly themes. Prior to the commencement of classes, parents will be provided with a comprehensive list of these materials for review, offering an opportunity for families to be involved in the educational journey. We welcome and respect parental input, allowing for the option to opt-out of certain readings without any impact on student grading. Please know that stories will be chosen with the utmost of care ensuring a respectful alignment with each family's values.

The class is structured to promote active participation via the use of discussions, role play, debate, story mapping, analysis and even show and tell. Writing assignments are designed to be approachable focusing on paragraph-style short essay responses that sharpen students' analytical and expressive skills without the pressure of long essays. This class is not just an academic endeavor; it's an invitation to explore the vast landscapes of human experience and emotion through the written word. It's an opportunity for students to open the door to a world where literature becomes a gateway to understanding the complexity and beauty of the human condition.

<u>Prerequisites:</u> Students should be able to read comfortably.

<u>Cost:</u> \$275 <u>Supplies fee:</u> \$10 Materials provided by student:

- Internet access to read online works of literature
- Note taking tools

Prealgebra – beginning algebra (Grades 6th-12th), 11:00 - 11:50am

Taught by Shelby Shaw

This course bridges the gap between basic arithmetic and high school algebra, providing students with a strong foundation in mathematical thinking and problem-solving. Topics include but are not limited to integers, fractions, decimals, ratios, proportions, expressions, equations, inequalities, square roots and their operations, functions, slope, polynomials, systems of equations and an introduction to quadratic equations. Students will explore real-world applications of algebraic concepts, use multiple strategies to solve problems, and build confidence in their mathematical reasoning. The course emphasizes hands-on activities, collaborative learning, and test preparation for either SUFS purposes or the PERT for those seeking Dual Enrollment. If your child has gaps in their knowledge, wants to step up to harder math classes or simply wants to review and prep for the PERT exam, this course is for you.

<u>Cost:</u> \$275 <u>Pre-requisite:</u> Students should be able to add, subtract, multiply and divide comfortably. Supplies Fee: \$10

<u>Supplies provided by the student:</u> note take materials, calculator (phone is fine), Barron's Painless Prealgebra, Barron's Painless Algebra. Both are located on the SUFS marketplace.

Performing Arts (all grades) 12:30 – 1:25pm

Taught by Jen Johnson

In this dynamic and creative course, students will explore the world of performing arts through acting, movement, music, and improvisation. The course encourages students to develop their self-expression, confidence, and collaboration skills in a supportive environment. Throughout the course, they will learn the basics of stage presence, vocal technique, rhythm, and movement. At the end of each semester, students will have the opportunity to showcase their skills in a class performance, demonstrating their growth and creativity. Join us for this fun elective!

<u>Cost:</u> \$275/year <u>Pre-requisite:</u> None <u>Supplies fee:</u> \$35 <u>Supplies provided by student:</u> Notebook, pens or pencils

Biblical Studies (Grades 6th – 12th) 1:30 – 2:20

Taught by Jen Johnson

Throughout this semester students will study the Bible to gain a better understanding of God's Word. They will learn how this remarkable true book, tells God's story of redemption and grace. Regardless of experience level or church background, students will gain a deeper understanding of the most influential and important book in history.

Cost: \$275 Pre-requisite: None Supplies fee: \$15

<u>Supplies provided by student:</u> a Bible (any translation), a notebook or journal, pens or pencils. Instructor will provide any study materials.

Biology with Lab (Grades 6th-12th), 2:30 – 3:25

Taught by Shelby Shaw

This Apologia course is designed to provide students with a foundational understanding of biology while also preparing them for college-level biology and the ACT.

Topics covered include the science and chemistry of life, ecology, cell structure and function, cellular energy, DNA and genetics, evolution, prokaryotes and viruses, protists and fungi, plant diversity and reproduction, plant structure and function, and the biology of various types of animals. Students will learn how to utilize the proper scientific method through weekly hands-on practice, how to record data and report it, and how to read, create, and utilize several types of graphs, a skill also required for the SAT and ACT exams. This class is an excellent option in particular for the "non-science" minded kid or parents who aren't quite sure how to handle the lab component of middle school/ high school science. Material will be broken down in a way anyone can not only understand but in which to excel!

<u>Cost:</u> \$275 <u>Pre-requisite:</u> Students should be able to read comfortably.

Supplies Fee: \$50

Supplies provided by the student: note take materials, Apologia Biology 3rd Edition, Apologia Biology

student notebook, Apologia microscope slides. All are located on the SUFS marketplace.

Note: not all students need the microscope slides. We have 6 microscopes so we only need about 5 students willing to buy. As other needs come up, like dissection kits, I will again ask who has funds to buy some of those shared costs.

When it's time to register, what do I do?

Print the Registration Handbook and the Family Handbook.

Print and Complete the registration forms, waiver agreement, activity form and medical form.

Arrive on the designated in-person registration days.

Check in at the lobby table where your paperwork will be reviewed for registration.

Review The Bridge Sarasota Private School handbook information and register, if desired.

See the Administrative Director to pay for Academy Classes and/or Private School Registration.

How, When and Where do I pay?

- ❖ A Non-Refundable Registration Fee of \$25 per student and \$10 technology fee per family is required to enroll, due at time of Registration.
- ❖ The **Full Balance** must be remitted on-site at Registration if you registered previously online.
- All Payments at on-site registration are cash, check, or money order. Make checks payable to THE BRIDGE SARASOTA. You may also pay online at our website with credit, debit or eCheck. Full payment is due at Registration.

What happens if a class is cancelled?

If THE BRIDGE cancels a class because the minimum enrollment was not met, you will be notified as soon as possible and offered a replacement class. Payments will be refunded if no class is suitable for your family.

Payment Reminders:

- Due to the increase of various funding options available to home school families, THE BRIDGE would like to clarify that we contract directly with enrolling families, not third-party organizations/individuals. Regardless of funding sources, all families are personally responsible for balances due, paid in full, at the time of registration. If you're receiving PEP scholarship funds, we are able to provide an invoice which you can use to request reimbursement from your SFO. We appreciate the relationships with our families and count it an honor to partner with you in the education of your children.
- There is no discount for enrolling more than one student.
- The Non-Refundable Registration Fee is per student, per school year.
- The Non-Refundable Technology Fee is per family, per school year.
- If THE BRIDGE cancels a class, you will be offered a replacement class.
- If a family drops a class and does not replace it with another class, they will forfeit the Registration Fee and Technology Fee.
- If a family drops a class within the first 3 weeks, a class fees refund will be issued. There is no refund after three weeks unless there are special circumstances.
- THE BRIDGE is able to offer payment plans. Please contact Maria (maria.white@thebridgesarasota.com) for more information.

Cancellations/Refund Requests prior to class start:

- ➤ Up to 6 weeks prior to the Co-op start date (7/17/25) will receive 100% refund of fees paid, minus the Registration fee and Technology fee.
- ➤ Up to 4 weeks prior to the Co-op start date (7/31/25) will receive 75% refund of fees paid, minus the Registration fee and Technology fee.
- ➤ Up to 2 weeks prior to the Co-op start date (8/14/25) will receive 50% refund of fees paid, minus the Registration fee and Technology fee.
- ➤ Requests made after 8/28/25 will be subject to no refund of fees paid.

- ✓ The Bridge Suncoast Academy Classes are here to support the other subjects your student is learning at home.
- ✓ Volunteers are needed to ensure the success of our Academy Classes. Please be sure to sign-up for any of our needs when you register. All families must volunteer or be charged a fee.
- ✓ Payment must be made when you register for classes.
- ✓ All families and students are required to attend the Family Orientation on August 28, 2025, at 10am.

How is Grade Level determined? Although many home school families do not emphasize grade levels, our teachers anticipate a certain *age group* when planning their classes. For this reason, it is important to sign up for classes where the child's age is standard for the grade level required.

Grades PreK-1: Approximate age is 5-6 learning phonics, letters, numbers Grades 2-4: Approximate age is 7-9 beginning reading and writing skill good reading and writing skills

Grades 6-12: Approximate Age is 13 - 18 read and write well/ has not graduated from high school

Once you are registered, you can contact the Teacher with questions or concerns through our Homeschool-Life portal.

Talk to your Teacher

- <u>Each Teacher determines class expectations</u>, letter grades, or performance evaluations.
- Classes are designed for enrichment, although parents may choose to give credit for high school courses.
- <u>Careful consideration has established each class</u> <u>size, grade level and content.</u> Please do not ask the teacher to change these limitations.
- If your student needs a Teacher Exception for age, skill, or prerequisite, please contact the Director or Administrator before enrolling.
- A Teacher Exception does not guarantee enrollment.
- If your child has a special need, learning disability, food restriction or allergy, please talk to the Administrator before enrolling for a class. Not all teachers are able to accommodate special needs. A Teacher Exception may be required.

Waitlist Questions and Policy: When a class reaches full enrollment, you may elect to put your student on a Waitlist.

Enrollment from the Waitlist is not guaranteed.

- ✓ If you choose to go on a Waitlist, you may **not** be enrolled in another class at that same time period.
- ✓ You may place your student on more than one Waitlist for any class in which they are not enrolled in another class.
- ✓ A Registration Deposit is not required to be placed on a Waitlist.
- ✓ THE BRIDGE Administration reserves the right to accept partial Waitlists as it deems suitable for a given class.

Please do not contact the Teacher about Waitlists. THE BRIDGE Administration makes the final decisions concerning class expansions after reviewing many factors. If a class expands, we will contact you. Class enrollment can change until the end of the second week of the current semester.

Perimeter Walk: 1-2 adults needed for each time period. Perimeter walk is one loop around the outside of the campus every 15-20 minutes, looking for anyone who does not belong on the campus or anything out of the ordinary. Bible Baptist staff are on site, so this is just an extra precaution. Shifts: 8:45-10:00am, 10:15-11:45am, 12:00-1:30pm, 1:45-3:30pm

Facility Setup - <u>8:00-8:45am</u>: 1-2 families - Using the written directions provided, setup classrooms and common rooms with appropriate tables, chairs, etc.

Facility Cleanup $-\frac{3:00-3:40pm}{1-2}$: 1-2 families – Using the written directions provided, put everything that we moved for the school day back so it's ready for BBC's services, take out trash, disinfect/clean restrooms, general facility cleaning and vacuuming.

Lunch Monitor & Cleanup – $\underline{11:45-12:40pm}$: 1-2 adults or families – Help students as needed. Monitor the room for safety. Clean/disinfect the tables and put back whatever was setup earlier. Vacuum as needed. Take out trash. Inform front desk when complete to lock building.

Entry table/Greeter – 1 adult - Be at the entry table to help and greet students and parents. (Friendly and cheerful!) Assist the Director as needed. (Make copies, refill refreshments cart, etc.) 8:45-10:30am, 10:30am-12:30pm, 12:30-2:00pm, 2:00-3:30pm

Prayer Team -2-4 adults meeting on Thursday for 30-60 minutes to pray - time frame determined by availability of team members. Students are welcome to join. (Need a leader.)

Games/Study Room Monitor – 1 adult responsible for monitoring the room for safety. This is a free-study and games room (non-quiet).

Teacher Assist (Elementary requires most parents to stay with their child) –Teacher assistants provide support for the teacher and classroom as needed: setup tables/chairs, make copies, help students with projects and labs, collect and/or possibly review homework, etc. Organize students to do classroom cleanup and take out trash each week. You're there to serve and support the teacher. This is most likely once or twice a month and will rotate.

It takes many hands for The Bridge Academy Classes to function smoothly. We need everyone who can volunteer to please do so. Our biggest needs are on Wednesdays during classes, but we do have other volunteer opportunities available.
