

Epi Pen Consent

Florida law, the Emergency Allergy Treatment Act (HB 1131), allows businesses like restaurants, theme parks, youth camps, and sports leagues to stock and administer epinephrine auto-injectors under specific circumstances. This includes establishing a protocol for administration by trained personnel and acquiring the auto-injectors through a prescription issued to the entity.

Teachers on staff have been trained to recognize the signs of anaphylaxis and to administer an epi pen. For the following students:
